And an opportunity for free teaching for all dancers of intermediate or advanced level


Volunteer dancers for RSCDS teaching exams

The teaching exams consist of each exam candidate teaching a class of two to three sets of dancers. The class typically includes teaching a formation or steps required in the dance as well as the dance itself. So we need dancers for the Exam class to teach, and would love you to volunteer if you are intermediate or advanced level. This is a great way of getting some free teaching!

The Exams will be held in two sessions: **9.00am - 12.00pm and 1.30pm - 4.30pm on 3 January.** We are also looking for volunteer dancers to help the candidates practise, in practice sessions from **1.30pm - 4.30pm on 30 December and 1 January.**

Dancing volunteers will not be required to dance for the full practice session or exam session.
