

Many of the places highlighted in the newsletters can be visited from #2 bus route. There's a bus stop close to Scots College, and they take cash or Gold Card. See the map at the Summer School office. On your return journey, find a 2S bus to take you close to Scots' College.

Book for the trip to Wellington's wildlife sanctuary at the Summer School office. An oasis of nature close to the city. Entry and transport is included in the ticket price. Residents will have a picnic lunch provided.

SOME EXPLANATIONS

Walk-throughs help you to prepare a dance by practicing the formations and pattern of a dance. It is walking, not dancing.

Hogmanay is a traditional Scottish celebration held New Year's Eve. There are many customs, for example, <u>first-footing</u>, the giving of symbolic gifts such as <u>salt</u>, <u>coal</u>, <u>shortbread</u>, <u>whisky</u>, and <u>black</u> <u>bun</u> (a rich <u>fruit cake</u>). Dancing and singing too

The *Grand March* is a ceremonial way to start a formal ball. As directed, couples (the person you want to dance with) march to the left and right alternately and proceed around the room. The couples join into fours, then eights, and sixteens to finish ready to form sets for the first dance.

A *Ceilidh* is a social event with casual dancing, musical performances, and dancing demonstrations. Wear your lightest clothes; it's often fast and furious.

The Mock Court is just for a laugh. We bring people to account for 'offences' during the Summer School. Ridiculous 'charges' are proclaimed, and the 'judge' gives a 'penalty' (such as leading down the middle and back wearing a silly hat).

FOR RESIDENTS

Door decorations: We would love you to colour an A4 piece of paper and display it in the plastic pocket beside your door. Paper and pens are in your common room.

Linen Change: There is an opportunity for fresh sheets and towels during Summer School. On your assigned day, leave your linen outside your door before you leave for your morning class. Pick up a clean set from your common room about 3.30 pm.
